The key deliverable for April to September 2010 was Activities 2.1 and 2.1: Provision of specialist training in collection and identification of evidence, and Provision of specialist training in laboratory methods. Both activities were delivered on time and within budget, receiving excellent feedback from participants. 29 individuals were trained on a 1 week Training Workshop, held in Kuala Lumpur from 2nd to 6th August 2010. Ten scientists and 19 enforcement personnel attended the Workshop, with scientists trained in laboratory techniques and enforcement officers trained in sample collection and storage, as well as issues relating to writing reports and giving evidence in court.

In addition, a regional Needs Analysis was completed to direct project activities from September 2010 onwards.

No significant unexpected changes or risks have been encountered. The project manager is leaving after completion of her 1 year contract as expected. In response to feedback from the 1st Annual Report the project manager's CV is attached. The second year of the project consists mainly of activities relating to laboratories, such as developing protocols and mentoring scientists as they develop new genetic tests. Therefore as experienced scientists the Directors of TRACE are best placed to realise these activities.
