<u>Output 2</u> (Improved understanding of elasmobranch fishing by Sri Lankan multiday fleet, including socio-economic drivers of elasmobranch fishing by the multiday fleet and the importance of shark catches to the poor):

Activity 2.1 is currently taking place as far as is currently possible. (i.e., analysis of BIOT arrest reports, catch records, interviews and secondary data)

A review of existing secondary and available primary data has been carried out in the form of a working party paper for the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission Working Party on Ecosystems and Bycatch, reviewing the status of the illegal fisheries of Chagos and an MSc thesis exploring the wider literature on elasmobranch fishing by Sri Lankan vessels, the socio-economic characteristics of the fishers involved and the drivers of this behaviour. This has included a meta-analysis of secondary data on shark catches across the Indian Ocean and a review of how shark fisheries have developed in Sri Lanka over time. National and local social and economic statistics have been used, along with arrest reports, interviews with captains and interviews with the Senior Fisheries Protection Officers working on patrols in the British Indian Ocean Territory. This was completed at the end of September. An analysis of the biological information collected from BIOT arrest data has also been completed.

There have been some unexpected developments arising which have prevented this project starting as promptly as planned.
