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PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION TIMETABLE

a) Outline progress over the last year against the agreed baseline timetable for the project. If some milestones have not been achieved or have slipped, explain reasons for this.

All key milestones (Table C) and project outputs (Table B) in the agreed baseline timetables have been achieved. Darwin Fellows 1 & 2 (Mr Mahadimenakbar Daewood and Mr Joseph Tangah, both from Sabah) have both completed their fieldwork and they're now at Durham for a period of two months to complete and submit their MSc theses (output 2). Darwin Fellows 3 & 4 (Ms Suzan Benedick and Ms Nazirah Mustaffa, both from Sabah) each received three months training in Durham from June to August 1999 (output 4D) and have both completed their first six months of fieldwork. UK staff visited Sabah in September - November 1999 and March/April 2000 (output 8: 28 weeks in host country). The reference collection of butterflies at the Forest Research Centre Sabah has been further enlarged and an additional reference collection has been established at the University of Malaysia in Sabah (output 8). All data collected during the first year of the project have been analyzed and drafts of four research papers have been completed (output 11). Some of these data were presented in two oral papers at the British Ecological Society conference December 1999 and in three research seminars at the University of Malaysia in Sabah, in September and November 1999 (output 14). An educational pack in English and Malaysian has been completed and is now being used by staff at the Environmental Education Unit at Danum Valley (output 7). Our two Sabahan collaborators have both visited the UK to receive training and gather information (output 6A).
