1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

The Project is running as planned and there was a smooth transition from end of original Darwin Project (12/021 - with a Project conference/workshop in Panama in late March 2006) and the new Post-Project (started 1 May 2006). Memorandum of Understanding between Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute, Panama and Heriot-Watt University, Edinburgh is in place. Darwin Fellows (as described in proposal) have started work on the project. UK project Leader (James Mair) and Julio Agujetas (PhD student/Darwin researcher) plus 4 MSc students travelled to Panama and took part in 10-day research cruise on STRI vessel as planned in late May/early June. Samples and information collected have started to be worked up and processed. In September 2006 MSc students presented research dissertations on Panama work for MSc degree - the 4 students who carried out fieldwork in Panama plus a student in Edinburgh working on taxonomy of Las Perlas samples in the National Museums of Scotland. Journal manuscripts from some of these research project results are now in preparation. In September 2006 PhD student Julio Aguietas left for Panama for extended stay to carry out regular monthly samples from Las Perlas as part of his planned research. STRI Darwin staff continue stakeholder discussion developments for Special Management Zone in Las Perlas. Discussions with Network partners continue (UK project Leader in Ecuador in September on other business and discussed further links with network partners there).
